# The Living Church: Being a Eucharistic People

If someone were to ask you "where is your church?", what would be your response? I suspect that for many of us, the obvious answer would be to give a set of directions or a street address. Though a simple question, this invitation to reflect on our notions of "the church" provides us with an opportunity to deepen our faith and understanding of the Holy Eucharist.

While it is true that the formal gathering space where we celebrate together as a community in Christ is the church building, it can be easy to forget that these four walls and a roof are simply the meeting place in which we come together as God's people. Gathered around the table of the Lord during the Mass, we are reminded through praise, prayer, and scripture that each one of us is equally loved by God, and called to one communion with Him through His son Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Joined together in the Mass, united through Christ in the Eucharist, there is no longer any distinction between the sinner and the saint, the meek and the strong, the righteous or the lowly. In receiving the gift of the Eucharist, each of us are filled with one spirit in Christ and joined in God's abiding love. Through the gift of the Eucharist, God accomplishes what He has desired for humanity from the beginning; that we all be joined together as one people, united with Him in one perfect loving relationship; in a word, the church.

But does our encounter with God end "at church" for the week after Communion is finished with the Blessed Sacrament sent to the homebound and the rest returned to the tabernacle? Surely not. Our communion with God in the Eucharist does not end when we leave the building, somehow leaving Jesus behind in the tabernacle waiting for us again next week. For just as Jesus fed the 5000 and the leftovers were collected into baskets, the miracle was not the leftovers collected up, but the grace by which the many multitudes were filled. So too let us be reminded that as we leave the building each week, in receiving the Body of Christ, each of us is united into the living church, carrying with us the light of Christ as a Eucharistic people.

This summer my prayer group decided to read Matthew Kelly's book 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory. We created a group chat to discuss this book together. Every day we read the five minute reflection and from the comments I could see how God was moving. We met at mass at Stella Maris to receive the Eucharist together on the day of the consecration. As I watched each woman go to receive the Eucharist I was deeply moved. We started standing up, but before long we were all on our knees. It was a beautiful moment. It truly felt like a new era was unfolding before our eyes.
